President's Corner

New Court Update

I was so excited to announce in February, the HOA voted unanimously to financially support the new 16-pickleball courts. Many of us know this has been a long time coming and would not have happened without the work of past PCPB Club Board of Directors and some very good member leaders. In addition to our Club members, Ed Robson personally has been very supportive of our efforts. Mr. Robson started by donating the land with the understanding it was specifically for pickleball courts and then followed it up with large amounts of monetary funding.

How did we get here?

John Pihl chaired the initial new court committee in 2017. The committee with John was Renee deLassus, Dennis Carter and Gordon Cooper. In several meetings with RCI and the HOA, there was general agreement the club needed more courts; the problem was where to put the additional courts.

All options were discussed, including, converting, or sharing tennis courts, using the dog park, looking at 'vacant' land in PebbleCreek, and using some of the parking lot. Using tennis courts was a definite no, the dog park was too close to homes (noise), and at the time RCI was unwilling to use any of the vacant land near the RV park, so the only option was using some of the parking lot near court 9.


A presentation was made at the general HOA board meeting in October 2018, featuring four courts in the parking lot near court 9. The presentation highlighted that PebbleCreek had the highest members per court as compared to other west valley communities. The four courts would at best, only be a temporary solution. After this presentation RCI made the offer of land near the RV park for additional courts.

Since the first committee meeting on new courts in 2017, all the PebbleCreek Pickleball Club Board of Directors have worked and moved us closer each year. And, on February 16, 2022, all these years of effort emerge victoriously.

Due to the timing of deadlines for the newsletter, it has only been a few days since the HOA Board vote so there is not any new information I can announce at this time. It is possible that by the time members are reading this, other updates may have come out. The PCPB Board will be meeting with the HOA and RCI to be discussing more court particulars and we will send out updates whenever information is available.

What's Next?

A top priority for the new PCPB Club Board of Directors will be to determine how the soon to be used 36 pickleball courts will be utilized. Since the new Board will not have been elected as you read this, there has been no discussion at this point.

At the time of this publication, voting will have just opened or will open within a few days. By now you may have seen short bio's from the candidates. We are fortunate to have such wonderful and dedicated individuals willing to serve.



Tournament

Another fantastic tournament was held here in PebbleCreek on February 9, 10, and 11. Mark Your Calendars – March 9, 2022

On November 10, 2021, at the Annual Meeting we tabled the discussion and vote on capital expenditures until we had more information on when the new courts would be completed and how much our \$500,000 would provide for our club. Now that we have HOA approval to cover excess expenses up to \$750,000, we can resume the vote on capital expenditures.

We will be holding a PebbleCreek Pickleball Club Membership Meeting on March 9, 2022. It will be held in the Eagles Nest Ballroom and start at 6:00 PM.

The Board will provide a review of the current financial positions of the club, and the previously proposed expenditures and the addition of a few new proposals, and an update on the new courts.

This meeting is extremely important for our members to attend, as voting takes place at the meeting and only the members in attendance determine what capital projects (if any) the accumulated surplus will be spent on.

As a review, here are the proposed expenditures from the November 10, 2021, meeting:

- Lighting for courts 13, 14, 19, and 20. If approved, the cost for lights will not exceed \$20,000.
- Construct a walkway with drainage and platform for additional seating between the ramada and court 1.
 - Currently, this is a rocky drainage area. If approved, the cost for improving this area will not exceed \$7,000.
 - A second concrete tier for seating between the ramada and court 1. If approved the cost will not exceed \$5,000.
- Improved lighting to double the lumens for courts 9-12. If approved, the cost will not exceed \$13,500.
- Concrete and drainage for additional seating behind courts 17-20. If approved, the cost will not exceed \$8,500.
- Post padding around the net poles on 20 courts. If approved, the cost will not exceed \$8,000.

Please mark your calendar and plan to attend this meeting. An agenda will be available on our website prior to the meeting.

Club Championship

The PebbleCreek Club Championship will be held March 10th (Women's), 11th (Men's) and 13th (Mixed). If you have not done so already, it is time to sign up on Court Reserve, under tournaments. Sign-ups will close several days before each event. Remember, both players need to sign up.

Brackets must have at least six teams, otherwise they will be combined with the closest level. We have asked for participants to provide their pickleball age (year born) in the registration. If a bracket has at least 16 teams registered, consideration will be given to breaking the skill bracket into two, based on the pickleball age of the youngest partner. We hope to have brackets starting at 2.5 and upward for every rating level.

It should be a fun three days of amazing pickleball. Snacks will be provided for all players and fans.

Update on Club Ratings for Next Season

The approach to club ratings for 3.0 and above involves two major components, skills, and competitiveness. Rating evaluations were held almost every week, whether for new experienced members who had moved into the community or for existing members wanting to move up. To give you perspective, over the past 4.5 months, the Club Raters handled over 125 rating requests. The bulk of the rating sessions were held for the 3.0 and 3.5 level, with less for 4.0, and very few for 4.5 and 5.0.

The overall approach of considering both skills and competitiveness in assigning club ratings will remain the same next year. The rating team is still only looking for the top players at each level as consideration for who should be evaluated for advancement. The basic skills and criteria for each level are on the club website under Ratings which can be found under Player Development or the Quick Links.

One significant change will be made around the logistics for rating sessions for 3.0, 3.5 and 4.0 players. There will be a standard day and time for rating sessions and a schedule will be published in advance for the year. Each level, for both men and women, will have a rating session once every two months during prime season and every three months during non-prime season. This equates to 5 sessions per year for 3.0, 3.5 and 4.0 players. Players will be able to request rating advancement on Court Reserve starting in March. Advancement to the 4.5 and 5.0 level will be through club tournament play, with rating sessions conducted on an exception basis.

If many people request a rating session on a given date, there may be a playoff session (ghost doubles, round robin, etc.) held in advance of that date to determine the top players for consideration.

Round Robin Information and "How to"

PebbleCreek Pickleball Club currently offers the largest variety of Round Robins (RR) ever! There is a gender and mixed round robin for each level from 2.5-5.0. Just a very few are combined levels if the numbers are low.



Sign Up

Sign Ups for RR is part of our Court Reserve program. Registration opens seven days prior to the round robin (the same night as the day it is held) and remains open until the event is full or 1 hour prior to the start. In some cases, you need to be online and hovering over your computer or phone by 6:55 PM or so, and ready to tap in exactly at 7PM, to get in. If you do not successfully get registered, you should be placed on a waitlist. Players are automatically moved into the round robin if space is available due to cancellations in the order they are on the waitlist. It is a good idea to check that waitlist a few times during the week to see if you have moved up. We have found that at times, if you are #1 or 2 on the waitlist, you might be able to join in if there are last minute cancellations.

No Shows

We want to make sure as many as possible can play each week. If you are registered and find that you cannot play, please drop out ASAP. In most round robins' players can drop out until 1 hour prior to the RR, but the sooner you drop out, the sooner the next person on the waitlist will receive an email notifying them that they are now registered and able to play. If you are on the waitlist, and have made other plans, please remove your name from the waitlist. It is unfair to fellow players to eliminate their chance to play simply because players do not cancel. Since Court Reserve sends an email reminder of the event players are registered in, it is difficult to understand why players would be so inconsiderate. (Yes, sometimes life does throw a curve, which is understandable, however, this should be a rare circumstance).

Arrival

Please make sure you arrive at least 10 minutes prior to the beginning of your RR. If you are in a large RR, 15 minutes would be even better. All signup sheets will be closed five minutes prior to the start of the RR; this allows the correct round robin charts to be posted and players ready to go at the start time. If you arrive after the five-minute mark, you may not be able to play. All players must leave the court at the end of their 1:45 minutes even if that means not finishing a game.

Eligibility

Only players who are registered on court reserve may play. Players may not invite others to join the round robin. Currently, registration allows for three players over the courts allocated to register.

Paddle Sharing

At times a player will want to only play every other game and will "share a paddle" with a friend. This is allowed if both players are rated for the level of the group they want to play in. Only one of the pair should register online. Paddle sharing players will then alternate who plays, game by game. Paddle sharing is especially helpful as the weather gets warmer.

Rally Scoring

If you look around and see that some of the other courts have finished, and you are one of the only courts left still playing, you should go to "rally scoring" to finish your game more quickly. With rally scoring, a point is scored with every serve and rally, no matter who served.

Play

The purpose of our RRs is to provide fun social/competitive play. Players should be kind to one another. Only the team on the side where the ball lands has the right to make the call. If there is disagreement on a ball call, advantage always goes to the opponent. You can also replay the point if all agree to do so. Please be good sports.

Safety

If your ball is hit onto the wrong court, or if you see a stray ball come onto your court, please call out loudly "BALL ON" as soon as possible. Players on that court should stop play rather than risk stepping on that loose ball. The point is played over when this happens. Any time there is a head injury, the player should not continue to play. As the heat rises, please be aware!

The Buzz About League Play

Since January, dozens of PebbleCreek pickleball players have been representing our community and making an impact in the Arizona Pickleball Players League (APPL).

The Arizona Pickleball Players League (APPL) is a statewide team-based pickleball league. It currently operates in the following regions: Southern Region (Tucson and surrounding southern Arizona area); Casa Grande Region (communities in the Casa Grande and surrounding area); East Valley Region (cities in the eastern Phoenix Metro and surrounding area); and West Valley Region (cities in the western Phoenix Metro and surrounding area).

APPL supports women's, men's, and mixed skill level flights in 2.5, 3.0, 3.5, 4.0, and 4.5/5.0+ increments depending on regional interest. There are currently over 300 teams and over 3,000 players participating this year!

Teams are organized by a captain and can have a maximum of 16 players on the roster. Each week, the captain brings six players to play on three doubles teams against the opposing team's six players. Each doubles team plays three matches consisting of two games to 11 (win by 2).

Points awarded each week determine team standings. At the conclusion of the league season, eligible teams advance to the State Championships in April.



Player Development Schedule

PebbleCreek Pickleball Club is happy to offer several opportunities for members to improve their pickleball skills. Below is a list of all the opportunities available to get valuable instruction.

Ball Machine Training – Friday 12:00 PM – 1:00 PM every other Friday

This is for anyone wanting to learn how to use the Club's ball machine. No reservation needed.

Intro To Pickleball - Saturday 2:45 PM - 4:30 PM

This is a session designed for residents new to pickleball. You don't need to be a member of the club to attend this training.

Instruction Skills 1.0 – Monday 4:30 PM – 6:15 PM

This is a session designed for members new to pickleball and have already taken our Intro to Pickleball class. need to be a member of the club to attend and upon completion individuals automatically receive a 2.0 rating if a Club member.

2.0 Skills with Coaching – Thursday 4:30 PM – 6:15 PM

This training focuses on and drills on proper technique of the basic Pickleball skills: Dinking, Serving, Return of Serve, Groundstrokes, Volleying, Overheads, Court Positioning along with an introduction to the 3rd shot drop. Coaches will assist the players with each of the above skills. Players at this level should already be able to understand and keep score.

2.0 Play with Coaching – Sunday 1:00 PM – 2:25 PM

This training focuses on game play and allows the player to apply what they have learned in the 2.0 Skills with Coaching session. With the help of the Coach, players will be given pointers dealing with their skills, footwork, and court positioning.


Skills and Strategies Training - Sunday 2:45 PM - 4:30 PM

Each session does a "deep dive" into various aspects of the game. We will rotate weeks between 2.5, 3.0 and 3.5 and above. The sessions use focused drills to help teach skills with an emphasis on the strategies behind each skill. At the end of each session there is an in-play coaching session where participants can put the new skills to the test with feedback from the coaches.



What's So Smart About a Smart TV?



Coaching for Courts has moved to CourtReserve



Is it time to up your game? Has the third shot drop given you the blues? We have professional grade coaches here in PebbleCreek that volunteer to help you become a better pickleball player. Due to the success of Coaching for Courts, we have moved the booking process to CourtReserve.

Our coaches provide their availability schedule which is uploaded into CourtReserve. From your PC or phone, you can select Coaching for Courts and scroll through to find a coach and time that works best for you. All coaching for courts is done between 1:00 PM and 6:15 PM on Court 17.

In February, the process was so smooth that over 40 bookings were completed. Here are step-by-step instructions to start improving your skills:

1. Within CourtReserve, select Coaching for Courts.
2. Find your coach and time that is available at least one week in advance.
3. To add additional players, search on first or last name and bring up to three friends. Remember, this is a fundraiser for the new courts, so maximizing the instructor's time is appreciated.
4. Click save. A message is sent to the coach and the players confirming the appointment.
5. Show up and have fun!
6. And remember, our coaches donate their time to help members improve their game while helping to fund the new courts. Donations are at the discretion of the member.
