

## **CRS Candidates Qualifying to Become an Aqua Player**

### **Step One**

- Play CRS and achieve a 4.500+ rating.
- Minimum of 30 games to qualify, must maintain 4.500+ for the last rolling 12 game period in CRS.

### **Step Two**

- Play 2 recreational sessions with Aqua Flight to be arranged by the Aqua Members. This will be several games with a variety of players and feedback. This can be requested as soon as possible after Step One is achieved.
- These sessions will be considered mentoring sessions, Candidate will get feedback and introduction to the play and the players individual styles.

### **Step Three**

- Play with 3 other 4.5 players in a peer session (Control Group), 2 games with each player. Games to 11, win by 1.
- Win 3 out of 6 games, automatic promotion.
- Score 46 total points in 6 games, automatic promotion. No matter the win/loss record.
- There is discretion to be promoted from the Control Group by the group's unanimous agreement based on experience on courts, close or competitive games or judgement.
- A Candidate that does NOT pass Step Three will stay at their assigned level and can requalify after 30 more CRS games and the 12-game rolling average requirement.

### **Step Four**

- Candidates will be PROMOTED and can Play in 4.5 round robin events.
- Must show competitiveness in the Round Robin as any player in any Round Robin.

## **Existing 4.5 Players moving to 4.75+**

Any current Aqua player can request movement to the 4.75 Level. The process for promotion will be the following:

### **4.5 to 4.75**

- Player may request increase from Ratings Panel
- The Ratings Panel will form a CONTROL GROUP from representative players from the 4.75 Players
  - Play with 3 other 4.5 players in a peer session (Control Group), 2 games with each player. Games to 11, win by 1.
  - Win 3 out of 6 games, automatic promotion.
  - Score 46 total points in 6 games, automatic promotion. No matter the win/loss record.
  - There is discretion to be promoted from the Control Group by the group's unanimous agreement based on experience on courts, close or competitive games or judgement.
