WHAT TO EXPECT FROM YOUR BUDDY

- Your Buddy will call to introduce themselves to you as your Club Buddy and set up a time to meet.
- Assist you in getting logged into Court Reserve if you have not already done so which may include assisting you download the Court Reserve App onto your phone.
- Your buddy will show you how to sign up for a Round Robin or a Coaching Class at your Level on Court Reserve, if you have not already figured it out.
- Your Buddy will explain when and how to sign up for Club Events such as Round Robins or Coaching classes.
- If you are at the same Club Rating, and schedules permitting, they will sign up for a Round Robin with you.

- Your buddy will set you up with other players and do a few Open play sessions with you.
- Introduce you to other players when at the courts together.
