<u>Court Allocation Committee</u>: Theresa Carter provided an update on the work of CAC.

The board accepted the recommendations of the Court Allocation Committee:

- The spring season ends May 27
- o No club events May 28 to June 3 (Relax and enjoy open play & drop in all day)
- o Summer schedule begins June 4 see attached. Note new dates/times.

We highlight the following:

One session for **Round Robin** play: 7:45 am - 9:30 am on courts 1 to 8.

Mixed Level Play: Monday and Wednesday on courts 4 and 5 at 930.

Player Development:

<u>Socials:</u> Kathy Delaney reported that plans are in the works for a no host social in July. And, consideration is being given to a new court celebration in the fall in lieu of a dinner dance. This is another opportunity to volunteer - please contact Kathy!

<u>Used shoes:</u> The board acknowledged Shirley Seymour for leading an initiative to collect used shoes for an area school. Though the board did not approve a bin to be set aside to collect shoes, the board encourages members to continue in their generous ways, and support Shirley as she collects shoes from time to time for the school.

<u>Grievances Committee</u>: Jeff Antrican brought up this idea at the last board meeting. The board asked Jeff to put together thoughts on how this might function and bring it to the board.

On the courts:

Court cleaning will become a more regular occurrence
Be careful with the ball machines - specifically when unplugging
Return balls to the sleeves when finished ... they get soft sitting on the court
Close the gates when finished so they don't slam in the wind
Some chairs need to be "re-slinged" - may take 10 days or so
The lines may be repainted this summer - will provide as much notice as we can
